# The CES, World-Changing Innovations



Let's face it, the world is changing. Being a child of the 1960s, I grew up with floppy disks, VCRs and my trusted white Sony Walkman (®). The first computer I ever worked on was MS-DOS. My first cell phone was a bag phone with 30 minutes of "free" airtime. And who can forget how excited we got when we first heard "You've Got Mail" from our AOL account.

Now there are self-driving cars, drones, video games, virtual reality and smart trash cans. Each year, new products and new technologies are featured at the annual Consumer Electronics Show (CES), in Las Vegas. The 2016 version of the CES Show was held earlier this month, from January 6 through January 9.

The CES is the world's largest gathering of the leaders of consumer electronics. The show dates back to 1967 and continues strong to the present day. It has served as the proving ground for innovators and breakthrough technologies. It's the global stage where next generation innovations are introduced to the marketplace. As the largest hands-on of its kind, CES features all aspects of the industry.

This year's event had 160,000 attendees, 3,800 exhibitors and almost 2.5 million square feet of exhibitor space. # SCCCI Annual Awards Banquet








#### **Dried Berry Granola**

#### Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups rolled oats
- ¼ cup almonds (crushed)¼ cup cashews (crushed)
- ¼ cup hazelnuts (crushed)
- ¾ cup assorted dried berries
- 1 ½ tbsp. raw sugar

- 1/8 tsp. of salt
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 2 tbsp. coconut oil
- 4 tbsp. local honey
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract

#### Directions:

Preheat oven to 325°. Mix together the oats, cinnamon, sugar, salt, and nuts. Over low heat, warm the coconut oil, honey and vanilla extract, pour over the dry ingredients and mix well. Spread the mixture evenly onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper and bake until golden brown, (15-20 minutes) turning the granola occasionally while baking. Add the dried fruit to the baking sheet during the last few minutes of cooking. Once the granola is a dark brown shade, remove from the oven, stirring occasionally while cooling.

Here are some Valentine's Day fun facts: More than 36 million heart-shaped boxes of chocolate are sold for Valentine's Day each year. About 8 billion candy hearts will be produced this year; that's enough candy to stretch from Rome, Italy to Valentine, Arizona 20 times and back again. Worldwide, over 50 million roses are given for Valentine's Day each year.\*


