Neil Bradley, Executive Vice President and Chief Policy Officer of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce recently released a report titled "A Slippery \$39 Billion Slope: New Data Analysis Makes Case for Trade, Not Aid".

In the article, Mr. Bradley addresses the impacts the tariffs are having on the current economy and the administration's proposal to spend \$12 billion to compensate farmers and ranchers for deepening economic losses during the ongoing trade war. As his paper mentions, although farming and ranching have been impacted by the ongoing trade war, thousands of U.S. companies are also impacted – including manufacturers, input suppliers, and businesses from numerous other industries.

The U.S. Chamber crunched the numbers to determine how much it would cost American taxpayers to extend the same relative level of financial aid the administration has proposed for farmers to other U.S. industries that have been negatively affected by retaliatory tariffs. Such an aid package would cost U.S. taxpayers an estimated \$39 billion - \$12 billion already extended to agriculture plus an additional \$27 billion to support other affected sectors.

Mr. Bradley ends his paper by stating the best way to protect American industries from the damaging consequences of a trade war is to avoid entering a trade war in the first place.

The administration's focus should be expanding free trade and removing these harmful tariffs, not allocating taxpayer's money to only marginally ease the suffering for some of the industries feeling the pain of the trade war.

As businesses in today's economy, we are impacted by many actions taken that are outside of our individual control. The ongoing trade war highlights other areas of concern, whether they be "over-the-top" regulations, extreme requirements to meet certification standards, the lack of reciprocity between states for professional certifications, and the list goes on. Many times, decisions are made, and it takes a few years for unintended consequences to show.

Just a reminder that your Chamber of Commerce is a voice for your business.
