Shelby County Historical Society & Museum: Dennis & Linda Hamilton Preserving Shelby County History

Back by the kitchenette in the Shelby County Historical Museum, you will find Dennis and Linda Hamilton from Pendleton, OR. Since mid-October 2017, they've been preserving Shelby County by taking digital images of court and probate records dating back to mid-1875 up to 1925. "We're here for another three weeks" (until the first week of July), Linda mentioned. "We're here on a mission through our church, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints". They showed Debbie and I their badges, FamilySearch Records Preservation Missionaries.

FamilySearch is a genealogy organization operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. It is the largest genealogy organization in the world. FamilySearch maintains a collection of records, resources, and services designed to help people learn more about their family history. FamilySearch gathers, preserves, and shares genealogical records worldwide. It offers free access to its resources and service online at FamilySearch.org, one of the most heavily used genealogy sites on the internet. In addition, FamilySearch offers personal assistance at more than 4,500 family history centers in 70 countries, including the Family History Library in Salt Lake City, Utah. (Source)

Dennis and Linda are from Pendleton, Oregon, a city in Umatilla County with a population of approximately 17,000 people. "Pendleton is in the eastern part of the state. We don't have a movie theater or a bowling alley. It's a very laid-back community", explained Linda. "It's such a treat to be in Harlan. There's so much more to do here." They enjoyed the Christmas lighting on the downtown square and in Pioneer Park and glad to see how the community supports school events.

Dennis operates the digital camera, provided by FamilySearch. Linda goes through the files from the Shelby County Court House, unfolding all the records and laying them flat in a legal-size folder. In a week's time they complete 5 – 6K images. The hard drive from the digital camera goes to Salt Lake City via Fed Ex. The hard copies of all the records stay at the museum.

When asked how they chose Harlan, both explained the missionary has a list of places where record preservation is needed. Des Moines was their first choice because their son and his family live there. Once they arrived in Des Moines, they found out that they were needed at the Shelby County Historical Museum here in Harlan. They are living at the Settled Inn on Hwy 59, but still have their apartment in Des Moines, where they stay on weekends. When asked if they would take another assignment, Linda said, "we'd like to be closer to home."

Before we ended our conversation, Dennis and Linda had a few words of advice when it comes to gathering your own family history. 1) Talk to your relatives now. 2) Document everything and make sure it is legible. 3) Write your life history.
