

Curried Cauliflower Soup



Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup raw cashews
- 2 tsp. extra virgin olive oil
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 1 large head cauliflower, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 (14-ounce) can light coconut milk
- 1 tsp. ground turmeric

- 1 tsp. evaporated cane sugar
- ¼ tsp. ground cinnamon
- ¼ tsp. salt
- Caramelized onions
- ¼ cup chopped cilantro

Directions:

Put cashews in a blender add ½ cup water & blend for 2 min. Pour cashew mixture through fine-mesh strainer, pressing on the solids with the back of a spoon, into a bowl. Set the cashew milk aside until needed. In a pot, heat the olive oil over low heat. Add onions & saute until golden. Add cauliflower, coconut milk, cashew milk, curry powder, tumeric, cumin, sugar, cinnamon & salt. Add enough water to cover. Bring to low boil, reduce heat & simmer until cauliflower is tender (~10 min). Blend soup with an immersion blender until desired consistency is reached. NOTE: If using a standing blender, allow to cool for 20 min. Pour soup into the blender. Start on low speed & blend until the soup is smooth. Return to the BLUE ZONES PROJECT

pot & reheat if serving hot. Ladle into bowls and garnish with onions & cilantro before serving Source: Blue Zones. LLC.
