- 5. Include online deals. About 10 million more Americans shopped online than in stores over Black Friday weekend. A survey released by the National Retail Federation on Sunday, November 27, 2016, estimated that 108.5 million Americans shopped online over the long weekend that kicks off the holiday shopping season in earnest, well above the 99.1 million who hit stores. In 2015, the numbers were about even for both avenues for shopping. (Source).
  - Online networks make it easy to feature deals with fun campaigns such as countdowns, contests, and games. Use the power of email when reaching out to your customers and advertising your deals both online and off for tempting in-store deals.
- 6. Create a consistent experience across all channels. The deals you are offering to your customers should always remain consistent. Train your staff to understand your individual deals, online-only offers, and any restrictions that apply.

The perfect time to build an emotional bond with your customers is during the holidays. Positive feelings of friendship, family, and gratitude are already at the forefront of the season and you can use these emotions for your marketing campaign. ## "Kick Start the Leader in You" Leadership Series to start October 13<sup>th</sup>!

With the success of our initial "Kick Start the Leader in You" workshop this past March, the Chamber of Commerce is very pleased to announce the expansion of this workshop into a full series.

The "Kick Start the Leader in You – Leadership Series" will expand on the topics of the original workshop and offer a more in-depth examination of the topics that will help develop new supervisors while offering a refresher to others. The total series is comprised of seven sessions discussing leadership principles. The initial session, a full day session (9:30 am to 4:30 pm), introduces multiple characteristics of being a leader and identifies the areas that will be examined in-depth during the instructional series. The additional six (6) sessions are held in the afternoon, each focusing on one facet of being a leader. Orlando Gil, president of TCTS Global, will be facilitating the series.

#### Series schedule:

Friday, October 13th: 9:30 am to 4:30 pm Friday, October 20th through Friday, December 1st: 1 pm to 4 pm each Friday (no class on Friday, November 24th)

Each student will receive a certificate at the completion of the program, HRCI learning credits are available (pending approval), a workbook to keep after the series, course materials, 2 ½ hour "coaching calls" at the end of the program to be used by the student when needed, a pre-brief and de-brief with each student's manager to set goals and provide feedback, and access to a private Facebook community leadership group.
